



## BYTE Demographic & Evaluation Data

The following report offers cumulative 2023 participant data as well as specific data broken into trimesters (Spring, Summer, Fall). It also includes results of BYTE’s 2023 impact evaluation.

Of particular interest to BYTE are its unduplicated student demographic data, which showed BYTE students come from 17 countries.

Trimester data includes specific BYTE courses, showing BYTE offers between 20-30 separate programs across its 14 in-person sites.
